





Introduction



The National Participation Team for Comhairle na nÓg organised and ran three Comhairle Members' Networking Events over the Easter holidays on 7th, 8th and 9th April 2021. Due to Covid-19 restrictions, these events were held online and were attended by a total of 101 participants from each of the 31 Comhairlí na nÓg around the country.

The purpose of the Networking Events is to give Comhairle members the opportunity to come together to share information and good practice, and to look at the challenges that they face and overcome in an informal way.

For the second year running, it was necessary to replicate the Networking events in an online format, bringing young people together from all Comhairlí around the country to complete a series of online activities and challenges

This report documents all of the engagements with Comhairle members over the three days and gives a run down of the schedule, outlining the key findings, the processes used, and the outcomes.

The report will be made available to all participants and will be used to inform the planning of future online events, as well as feeding into the theme for Dáil na nÓg 2021.



Brief on Dáil na nÓg and the National Executive process By National Executive members...





- Dáil na nÓg is a key national event in the Comhairle na nÓg calendar. It takes place every two years (on alternative years we have the Comhairle National Showcase)
- 200 Comhairle members attend, representing each of the 31 Comhairlí
- Dail na nÓg delegates have the opportunity to participate in workshops on the chosen theme for the day.
- The theme is generated from the list of topics that are currently being worked on by Comhairlí around the country. At this year's Networking Events, Comhairle members will have the opportunity to prioritise the topics on this list that they feel are most important for young people.
- The top ranking topics will then be circulated as a survey to Comhairle members all over the country to allow the wider Comhairle community to have their say on the theme for this year's Dáil na nÓg.
- Delegates at Dáil na nÓg will be tasked with coming up with a series of recommendations based on this theme to affect change for young people in this area.
- At the end of the day, delegates have the opportunity to vote on the key topic or recommendation under this theme
- The topic that receives the most votes will form the basis of the work plan of the incoming Comhairle na nÓg National Executive



Brief on Dáil na nÓg and the National Executive process, contd...

- In advance of DNN, one representative from each of the 31 Comhairlí na nÓg is elected to the Comhairle na nÓg National Executive.
- This group is tasked with following up on the recommendations by the young people at the workshop discussions at Dáil na nÓg
- The National Executive has a term of office of two years
- The National Executive is facilitated and supported by the Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration and Youth, and the National Participation Office who ensure that they get the opportunity to engage with the appropriate Ministers, policy-makers, Oireachtas Committees and other decision-makers.



Breakout Session II

Purpose of this session was to give young people a chance to find out information about the potential topics for the National Executive to work on which will be voted on at Dáil na nÓg 2021.

There were 7 topics to discuss. These topics are based on those that Comhairle members are working on throughout Ireland.

- MENTAL HEALTH
- EQUALITY
- BODY IMAGE
- LGBTI+ & INCLUSIVITY
- SOCIAL ISOLATION & YOUTH RESILIENCE
- YOUTH FACILITIES
- DRUGS & ALCOHOL


The Big Vote




Rank these topics in order of preference for Dáil na nÓg 2021:


